LAST TIME OUT

September 15- Leesville 28 @ Garner 21

Garner ran out of time in a heartbreaking 28-21 to Wake Co, rival Leesville Road on Friday, September 22, at South Garner Stadium. The Trojans took an early 7-0 lead on a Marque Maultsby pick-six, only the game's second play. It was Maultsby's second touchdown on the season.

Noah Burnette kicked the Pride into gear on the following drive though, nailing a 50-yard field goal.

After another three points from Burnette, Landon Chaboy recovered a fumble and returned it 40 yards to the house. The Pride converted for two-points and held a touchdown lead at halftime.

Jaydin Dixon capped the opening drive of the second half with a 22-yard rushing score. Dixon, proving to be the feature back for Garner, ran for 104 yards on 11 carries.

Penalties largely halted the pace-of-play during the third quarter. Garner would lose 225 yards on penalties alone.

With 41 seconds remaining Vincent Amendola nailed Trey Knox on a 59-yard crossing route to put Leesville up by one score.

David Sohn would haul in another 59-yard toss from Amendola to make in 28-14 Pride early in the fourth quarter.

However, the Trojans fought back with time waning in the fourth quarter. With under four minutes to go, Ahkee Vaughn caught his third touchdown of the season from Nolan McLean.

On the ensuing drive, Amendola fumbled the first snap from scrimmage and Daveion Carrington recovered for the Trojans. Despite four snaps in the red zone, Garner was thwarted.

Still with 42 seconds Garner's Justin Lewis returned a Leesville punt to the Pride 15-yard line. McLean found Lewis at the Leesville two and set up Garner in prime position with under 30-seconds to go.

After Jaydin Dixon was stopped on second down, a fumbled snap cost Garner too many seconds to reset the ball before the clock hit zeroes. The Pride beat Garner for the first time in history, 28-21, sending the Trojans off to their worst start since 1982.

Garner scores early and often to roll to 58-7 halftime lead over Rolesville and then they call off the dogs in the second half to finish 7-0 in the GNRC. The Trojans (10-1) await their NCHSAA seed, virtually certain to be #2 in the Mideast with home game Nov. 18th. **Anthony Stephenson** rumbles in from 16 yards, senior **Collin Eaddy** hits paydirt from 9, **Cody Carpenter** 31-yard TD to **Justin Lewis**, **Donovan Evans** 40-yard TD for 30-0, including the Trojans 6th safety of the year on **Daiveon Carrington** tackle in the end zone in the first quarter. Stephenson scores again on 3 yard carry with the always stout Garner defense keeping the Rams without a first down in the first 6 possessions. **DJ Holloway** 34-yard TD at 8:34 to halftime & Eaddy scores again from 26 yards out. **Prestige Bellamy** 33 yard TD completes the destruction to keep Garner unbeaten in their temporary home at S.Garner this season.

LAST TIME IT HAPPENED

GARNER WAS SHUTOUT:

August 20, 2010 – vs. Millbrook 3-0 (at Trojan Stadium)
 Millbrook's 3-0 victory over Garner ended the Trojans' scoring streak which had been intact since the 2008 season opener when Millbrook defeated the Trojans 34-0 at Trojan Stadium. The streak had reached 25 games before the loss.

SECOND YEAR'S BATTLE

You will not want to miss the QB battle going on tonight between Nolan McLean and Noah Douglas. McLean has been the starter for Garner since day one, but Douglas overtook Rasran Amon in week two and shone brightly against Needham Broughton last week. Douglas and McLean both have strong arms, but both are working in balanced systems that traditionally use a committee of running backs. However, in the passing game, the Garner secondary has excelled against aerial QBs. Notably snagging interceptions off of Vincent Amendola (Leesville) and Darius Ocean (Cleveland) for touchdowns. Meanwhile, McLean has only tossed three picks, bringing his average to under 1 INT per game. It wouldn't be surprising to see a slower pace of play that favors chunk yardage in the passing game since Rolesville has found their QB.

MAMA, I'M COMING HOME

The 2017-18 school year will complete a two-year hiatus for Garner away from the original site of Garner High School. The Trojans moved all of its operation to what will be South Garner High School last school year while a complete renovation of Garner Magnet High School took place. The renovation will include upgrades to Trojan Stadium including a new press box, concession stands and restroom facilities. When Garner returns to Trojan Stadium in 2019 it will mark the 50th year that the school on Spring Drive has been in existence.

GROUND AND POUND

The Trojans have five players who have rushed for over 100 yards already this season (Dixon, Clemons-Wilson, McLean, Evans, Bellamy). The ground game has produced 854 season yards for Garner.

ARM AND LEGS

Sophomore quarterback Nolan McLean is the only Trojan with a passion statistic this season. McLean has 891 yards through the air, which is more than the entire running unit combined. McLean has also rushed for 114 yards.

RAMS ARE ONLY KIDS

Rolesville High School is the second-youngest public high school in Wake County (Apex-Friendship, 2015) having opened only in 2015. RHS is a split of the former Wake Forest-Rolesville High School (1941-2012) into two separate institutions. Youthfulness has halted much football progress for the Rams, but this year's class is the first to have had football all four years of high school.

TOWN OF ROLESVILLE

Rolesville, N.C. was incorporated as a town on January 18, 1837 by the General Assembly. It is the second-oldest town in Wake County. Due to a population spike (to around an estimated 7,000 people in 2017) the town did not have its own high school until 2013. The town was named for William H. Roles, the town cotton merchant and postmaster.

TOWN OF GARNER

Garner, N.C. was settled in 1751 as the village of Garner's Station but was not chartered as a town until 1905. Notable people from the town of Garner include: Arlie Honeycutt (Miss North Carolina 2012), and Wake County Sheriff Donnie Harrison.

IT AIN'T JUST FOOTBALL

John Wall, David West and Donald Williams all spent time playing basketball for Garner under legendary head coach Eddie Gray. Wall and West still play in the NBA for the Warriors and Wizards respectfully. Williams was the 1993 NCAA Final Four MVP with the National Champion University of North Carolina Tar Heels.

IS IT OCTOBER YET?

Garner has suffered the worst September in recent memory and will end the nightmare month tonight. A loss tonight would make it the worst September in the last five years.

GARNER

12 McLean, N. (So): Despite being only a sophomore, McLean has proven himself to be a leader on the team. The Trojan QB has thrown for 9 TDs and 891 yards. He is on pace for 2,000 yards this season. McLean is also a standout for the Garner baseball team and won GNRC Player of the Year honors as only a freshman.

10 Dixon, J. (Sr): The Trojans have longed to find a feature back to accompany McLean in the backfield and Jaydin Dixon seems to be it. Dixon has eclipsed 100 yards rushing in each of the past two games and has the co-leader in rushing TDs with a pair.

17 Lewis, J. (Sr): Lewis is the top wide receiver for Garner, but does a lot more than catch passes. Lewis also handles punt returning duty for the Men of Troy. He missed a pair of games with a lower body concern in weeks two and three.

11 Vaughn, A. (Jr): No one could blame you for overlooking the 5'7" WR, he's the shortest in the receiver corps, but he leads the team in reception TDs (3). While only having 85 receiving yards, Vaughn is a dangerous option in the red zone.

8 Maultsby, M. (Sr): Maultsby has picked off two footballs this season, both have gone for touchdowns, look for him to be big against a pass-heavy offense.

18 Douglas, N. (So): The football is going to fly with Douglas at the helm. The sophomore took over the QB job from Rasran Amon in the second week and chucked a 50-yard and 49-yard TD last week vs. Broughton

9 Bobbitt, K. (So): First-year varsity player Kishawn Bobbitt is one of the motors that power the running game. He is the most highly viewed profile on the team's Hudl site and boasts a 4.56 40-yard dash and is the team leader in yards (through week 2 stats found).

6 Webster, A. (Jr): Slot receiver Amir Webster gets a lot of targets and a lot of receptions. He has an extended route tree that favors the wheel and the slant, look for him to make matchups tough on the Garner DBs.

LAST CALL FOR NON-CONF PLAY

The final non-conference game of the season doesn't carry the weight it normally would for Garner's record. The Trojans best hope to make the state playoffs is to finish first or second in the SWAC. Garner's two most challenging games, on paper, are October 20, at Fuquay-Varina and November 3, at Middle Creek.

The new playoff seeding format is run on a MaxPreps.com metric, which counts strength-of-schedule as a factor instead of wins only.
